He enjoyed a successful business career, building on his training as an engineering draughtsman. He worked as a Building Services Consultant and, from this, in 2015 he set up his own infrastructure consultancy business. Bill will be sorely missed by many people in this area and we send condolences to Louise, William & family.

**Geoff Broom** died in Somerset on 5th February, aged 82. Geoff & wife Lynda lived in H/ford for about 20 years, before moving to Somerset in 2019. Geoff, a proud son of Gloucestershire, was an economic geographer by training. Latterly he specialised in economic modelling, through which he developed a successful consultancy. Geoff did a lot for our village, e.g. the Parish Hall committee, the History Society and Fordstock plus he drove the Harbourne Shuttle. For eight years he was on the Parish Council. Four of these were as Chair, a role to which he applied his customary insight, diligence & fairness. Geoff lived a full & varied life. His passing leaves a huge void for his family and many friends.
