Last year in Devon, 600 volunteers helped more than 58,000 people work through their issues. 97% of volunteers said they would recommend volunteering with CA. Demand for help from CA is expected to continue rising in the years ahead as financial and housing pressures bite. To help meet this demand, the new Help Your **Community** campaign aims to increase the number of volunteers providing frontline advice, work on research and lobbying, help with administration and support jobs such as IT and fundraising. For many roles, previous experience isn't necessary - everyone receives thorough training. With CA, you're part of a supportive team, so you're never working alone. 
